Dear Ms. O'Brian and Ms. Bowman:

Exeter Associates, Inc. ("Exeter") is pleased to submit this proposal to assist the Staff of the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC" or "Commission") in conducting a review of the request for the renewal of the Rate Stabilization Clause ("RSC") of Atmos Energy Corporation, ("Atmos" or the "Company"). Exeter will also assist in the review of the annual RSC filings, should the Commission approve an extension, for the three-year period 2026 through 2028. In performing the audit, Exeter will work closely with the Commission's in-house Legal, Auditing, and Economic Staff. As requested in the RFP and discussed in greater detail later in this proposal, Exeter's total budget estimate is \$98,765, consisting of \$95,765 for professional services and \$3,000 for expenses.

#### **Principal Issues**

Exeter will work together with the Commission Staff to address the following principal issues outlined below as it relates to Atmos' historical, current, and proposed RSC:

- 1. Comprehensive review of Atmos' RSC;
- 2. Evaluation of any modifications proposed by the Company;
- 3. Assessment of the extraordinary clause provision;
- 4. Analysis of the authorized rate of return and overall cost of capital;
- 5. Review of the reasonableness of the Company's capital structure;

- 6. Examination of the O&M benchmark cap;
- 7. Assess whether any additional modifications should be recommended; and
- 8. Analysis of the earnings bandwidth.

#### Plan of Action

Exeter proposes to carry out this work by performing the following tasks:

- 1. Conduct a comprehensive review and analysis of the RSC renewal proposal made to the Commission for the test years of 2026 through 2028;
- 2. Review of Atmos' supporting testimony and workpapers;
- 3. Conduct discovery, including the preparation of written data requests;
- 4. Review the responses to discovery requests, workpapers, financial data, and historical data;
- 5. Review all necessary prior Commission orders;
- 6. Conduct technical conferences with the Company, as necessary, to confirm facts, collect additional information, and obtain the Company's explanations for various positions;
- 7. Prepare and file direct testimony, as well as cross-answering testimony if necessary, together with all supporting exhibits;
- 8. Provide testimony before an administrative law judge in either a contested or stipulated hearing;
- 9. Assist with the preparation of applicable motions, exceptions, briefing sheets, and orders of the Commission; and
- 10. Participate in settlement negotiations with Staff and the Company to determine whether issues can be resolved without litigation.

Exeter will assist Staff with the necessary action above until the issuance of the final Commission order and will continue assisting with review of each annual report and RSC filing for the subsequent three years. Exeter understands that the time period estimated for completion is approximately 15 months, with the overall time period depending on the extent to which matters are contested. Exeter would begin work shortly after notification of selection. We would anticipate discovery and preparation of Exeter's evaluation and findings to take place over a period of eight to ten months, with hearings to follow on a schedule established by the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) assigned to the proceeding. Should the Commission grant an extension, Exeter understands the timeline of our engagement would continue through review of Atmos' 2029 RSC filing that would be based on a 2028 test year.

#### **Exeter Qualifications**

A detailed description of Exeter's corporate qualifications and the qualifications has been included as Attachment A to this proposal. Exeter is well-qualified to provide the assistance that the Commission requires in this proceeding. Exeter has extensive experience addressing utility regulatory matters before the LPSC, as well as other state and

federal regulatory agencies. The firm's experience includes extensive work in analyzing alternative ratemaking mechanisms, rate stabilization clauses, and formula rate plans. In addition, Exeter possesses deep expertise in regulatory Commission policy; cost prudency; and the operations, books, and records of utility companies. Exeter has also provided expert testimony on all aspects of utility regulation and ratemaking. The issues addressed in Exeter's past work relevant to the work anticipated in RFP 25-12 include:

- Regulatory policies related to cost recovery and returns on extraordinary levels of capital expenditures;
- Cost of capital, capital structure, and ROE;
- Utility best practices and the pace of proactive, risk-based assessment and remediation of obsolete materials, including bare steel, cast iron, Aldyl-A, PVC, and other legacy pipe;
- Prudency of capital investments necessary to provide safe, reliable, and quality service;
- Earnings bands;
- Identification and evaluation of recoverable O&M expenses;
- Accounting deferrals and regulatory assets;
- Bill impact analysis;
- Appropriate accounting standards and practices for utilities, public utility accounting, and generally accepted auditing standards;
- Appropriate ratemaking adjustments to utility accounting records;
- Appropriate allocations of costs to base rates and fuel charges;
- Costs passed through a purchased gas adjustment ("PGA") which are considered reasonable and prudent, and appropriate and/or eligible for recovery pursuant to Commission orders, which are necessary for the provision of gas service and which have or will produce just and reasonable rates;
- Utility taxation;
- Federal and state pipeline and gas-safety regulations;
- GIS mapping and digitization of legacy analog records and pipe inventories;
   and
- Performance metrics such as historical leak inventories.

Exeter is especially well-suited to conduct this investigation because of its directly relevant Louisiana experience. Over the past 40 years, Exeter has worked for the Commission on numerous regulatory proceedings that include review of Atmos' Trans-La and LGS RSCs as well as dealing with utility fuel purchases and usage recovery eligibility. Some of the directly relevant projects that Exeter has undertaken for the Commission include:

- The investigation of the PGA filings of Entergy Louisiana, LLC's (ELL's) for the period January 2012 through December 2015 in Docket No. X-3413, the period January 2016 through December 2017 in Docket No. X-34852, and the period January 2018 through December 2020 in Docket No. X-35908.
- The investigation of the PGA filings of CenterPoint Energy Arkla and CenterPoint Energy Entex for the period January 2018 through December 2020 in Docket Nos. X-35911 and X-35909, respectively, and the investigation of the PGA filings of Arkla and Entex for the period April 2012 through March 2014 in Docket No. X-33480.
- The investigation of the PGA filings of Atmos for the period April 2012 through March 2014 in Docket No. X-33480, and the period April 2020 through March 2022 in Docket No. X-36400.
- Presentation of Staff's recommendation regarding the renewal of Atmos' RSC for Louisiana Gas Services and Trans Louisiana Gas Company of the Staff of the Commission. Atmos Energy Corporation (Louisiana Public Service Commission Consolidated Docket Nos. U-28814 et. al.), May 2006

## Other Relevant Experience includes:

- Review of the Rate Stabilization Pilot Program of Arkla and Entex for the 2004-05 through 2006-07 winter seasons.
- The investigation into Entergy Louisiana, LLC's fuel adjustment clause (FAC) filings between 1975 and 1998.
- The investigation into whether Trans Louisiana Gas Company and Louisiana Gas Service Company included inappropriate or imprudent costs in their purchased gas cost recovery mechanisms from 1981 through 1994.

The above work for the LPSC is in addition to directly relevant experience of the proposed project team addressing similar issues to those raised in this case, as described below.

#### **Project Team**

Each engagement undertaken by Exeter becomes the direct responsibility of one of our principals—the president or one of the vice presidents. The manager of each project is responsible directly to the Board of Directors, which comprises all of the principals. Mr. Matthew T. Hoyt, a Principal and Vice President at Exeter, will serve as Project Manager for

the review of the Atmos RSC. Mr. Jerry D. Mierzwa, another Principal at Exeter, will assist Mr. Hoyt and serve as an alternative Project Manager.

Exeter proposes two expert witnesses for this proceeding. Mr. Jared N. Geiger, a Senior Analyst at Exeter, will present testimony on all issues related to Atmos' RSC, including the extraordinary clause provision and the O&M benchmark cap, and will put forward any necessary recommendations. Mr. Geiger will also conduct the review of the annual RSC filings, should the Commission approve a three-year extension. Mr. Brendan Larkin-Connolly, a Managing Consultant at Exeter, will be the expert witness on all issues related to cost of capital and earnings, this includes the authorized rate of return, overall cost of capital, the reasonableness of the capital structure, and the earnings bandwidth.

Mr. Hoyt and Mr. Jerry D. Mierzwa will assist Mr. Geiger and Mr. Larkin-Connolly with the RSC review and preparation of testimony, respectively. Complete resumes detailing the qualifications and experience of the proposed personnel have been included as Attachment B to this proposal. Other Exeter staff will also be available to support Mr. Geiger and Mr. Larkin-Connolly as needed.

#### **Staff Experience**

<u>Jared N. Geiger.</u> Mr. Geiger is a Senior Analyst with Exeter and has 17 years of experience in the public utility industry. He joined Exeter from Atmos Energy, where he was directly responsible for planning, managing, and filing general rate cases in Colorado, Kansas, and Texas. His work also included oversight of tariffs, PGA filings, annual infrastructure riders, ad valorem tax filings, demand-side management program riders, and low-income program riders. Mr. Geiger has provided testimony on class cost-of-service studies, rate design, billing-determinant studies, tariffs, rate consolidation, and customer-usage forecasting, including customer-growth forecasts, declining-usage adjustments, and weather-normalization adjustments. He has participated in numerous settlement conferences, Commission rulemakings, and technical conferences involving utilities, Staff, and various intervenors.

Brendan Larkin-Connolly. Mr. Larkin-Connolly is a Managing Consultant with Exeter and has 18 years of experience advising on utility rates, regulation, and infrastructure finance across domestic and international jurisdictions. He has provided expert witness testimony in more than 25 state-level regulatory proceedings on behalf of consumer advocates and regulatory staff. Mr. Larkin-Connolly has particular expertise assessing the necessity, reasonableness, and prudence of utility capital-expenditure programs, including accelerated infrastructure replacement plans and the ratemaking mechanisms used to recover those costs. He previously served as an Economist at the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities, where part of his responsibility was reviewing requests from utilities to issue new debt.

<u>Matthew T. Hoyt.</u> Mr. Hoyt has over a decade supporting utility commissions, consumer advocates, and large consumers in state regulatory proceedings addressing ratemaking issues including energy supply acquisition, resource planning and resource adequacy, and rate design. He has provided testimony in cases addressing state policy issues, rate design, and transmission planning, as well as published reports and academic journal articles on topics including wholesale and retail market design, resource adequacy, dynamic rates, and more. He joined Exeter after previously working as a data scientist at a retail energy supplier.

Jerome D. Mierzwa. Mr. Mierzwa is a Principal and the President of Exeter. He joined Exeter

from National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, a major interstate pipeline, where he was involved in preparing gas supply studies, rate forecasts and least-cost purchasing analyses. Mr. Mierzwa has presented cost allocation and rate design testimony in hundreds of gas, electric, water and wastewater utility proceedings, including before the LPSC.

## **Cost Proposal**

Exeter proposes to support Staff with Atmos' RSC filings in the manner proposed above for a budget not to exceed \$95,765 for professional services plus direct expenses not to exceed \$3,000 for a total budget estimate of \$98,765. Exeter will bill for professional services at our standard hourly billing rates which range from \$102.5 per hour for Research Assistants to \$250 per hour for Mr. Larkin-Connolly. Direct expenses will be billed at cost. The standard hourly rates of the witnesses and the other members of Exeter's staff who are anticipated to assist the Commission in this matter are presented below:

#### **ELECTRICITY**

Exeter staff has been continuously involved in electric utility industry regulatory issues since the Company began operating in 1981. Exeter has provided expert witness testimony in hundreds of regulatory proceedings before state and federal regulatory commissions. This testimony has been on behalf of commission staffs, consumer advocates, and federal and state government clients. In addition, Exeter personnel have provided consulting and prepared reports/studies addressing broad policy issues facing particular states and industry-wide regulatory concerns.
